


Kent is also our current Facility Manager at Holy Family Parish. Kent is a talented musician and shares theses talents as part of Holy Family Music ministry.

UNTROUBLED HEARTS

One Saturday night, a pastor was working late and decided to call his wife before he left for home. It was about 10:00 PM, but his wife did not answer the phone. The pastor let it ring many times. He thought it was odd that she did not answer but decided to wrap up a few things and try again in a few minutes. When he tried again, she answered right away. He asked her why she had not answered before, and she said that it had not rung at their house. They brushed it off as a fluke and went on their merry ways. The following Monday, the pastor received a call at the church office, which was the phone that he had used that Saturday night. The man that he spoke with wanted to know why he had called on Saturday night. The pastor could not figure out what the man was talking about. Then the man said, "It rang and rang, but I didn't answer." The pastor remembered the mishap and apologized for disturbing him, explaining that he had intended to call his wife. The man said, "That's okay, let me tell you, my story. You see, I was planning to commit suicide on Saturday night, but before I did, I prayed, 'God if you're there, and you don't want me to do this, give me a sign now.' At that point, my phone started to ring. I looked at the caller ID, and it said, 'Almighty God'. I was afraid to answer!" Don't we face all situations in our lives, and we want someone to be with us?

St. John is bringing us once again to the scene of Last Supper. Jesus is sitting with his disciples and talking with them about the possible things that are going to happen to him in the near future. This must have made his disciples worried, upset, stressful and anxious. They must have wondered why he was talking like this to them. Sometimes we too go through the similar situation where we get upset and anxious about our future and relationships as well. Furthermore, we start looking for some support and help. Sometimes our problems are too big to handle that some people

decide to end their lives. However, Jesus is reminding us that our hearts should not be troubled, and we should be free of our fears. To make our hearts untroubled, he makes the biggest promise ever made in the history of Salvation by sending the Holy Spirit, the Advocate. The Holy Spirit always helps us to have untroubled hearts as he fills our hearts with the Love of God.

Let us bring our troubles to the Lord asking him to help us to trust in his loving mercy, so that we may have untroubled hearts to glorify him.




Catholic Education Week (May 10 - 14)

Holy Father's May 2021 Prayer Marathon




Vatican's new document on climate crisis

The climate crisis has a very human face. It is already a reality for multitudes of vulnerable people worldwide. Climate warming of merely 1.5°C would cause global sea levels to rise by 0.77 metres by 2100, threatening cities and crop and pasture land around the world. Projections based on current data predict a global temperature increase of 3-4°C by 2100.



The Vatican's Migrants and Refugees Section of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development has recently published and presented a resource document entitled, <u>Pastoral Orientations on Climate Displaced People</u>. The resource highlights the new challenges posed

by climate disruption and displacement and suggests pastoral responses to the global situation and crisis.
