Holy Family Parish Quarterly Financial Report January 1st to March 31st, 2021

We have now been dealing with the pandemic for over a year and we understand that things have been very challenging for our families, our businesses, our churches, and our Diocese. Our church attendance has been reduced due to the current circumstances and our programs have moved on-line or been eliminated. We are grateful for the current technology that allows us to offer Sunday Mass to our parishioners. We are also very grateful for the continued generous financial support to our parish and for the generous offers of time and talent from all our volunteers, and to everyone who continues to pray for all of us.

During the first three months of this year, we have received \$142,600 in donation from envelopes, preauthorized transfers, credit cards, and cash, very close to budget. In addition, we received \$10,000 from a bequest, \$19,500 in government subsidies (Canadian Emergency Wage Supplement -2020), and \$10,700 in other donations from sale of church supplies, stole fees, etc. Our total income was \$182,000.

In addition to these donations, we received \$13,000 for special collections such as Knight's of Columbus, Loonies for Lent.

Our expenses for salaries, administration, music, maintenance, and utilities, etc. totalled \$91,600. Diocesan Support was \$23,900. Our expenses were under budget. Our net income for the period was \$67,000 over budget due to the bequest and government subsidies and due to keeping our expenses at a minimum. The repairs of the heating and cooling system in the administration area are almost complete.

In addition to automated sources of payment such as Pre-authorized payments, credit card charges, and donations to Holy Family Parish directed through the Calgary Diocesan Website, we now have another option available – use of E-Transfer – using the email address: accounting@holyfamilymh.ca.

Even with the difficulties of the current pandemic situation, we have much to be thankful for. We have caring clergy who continue to minister to the needs of the parish. Our office staff and custodian have been working diligently to keep things running smoothly.

We are also very thankful for your generous financial support at this difficult time, and we ask for your continued support.



Feast of Ascension of Our Lord Year B - Sunday, May 16, 2021

LET OUR HEARTS ASCEND

St. Augustine says "Today our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven; let our hearts ascend with him. Listen to the words of the Apostle: If you have risen with Christ, set your hearts on the things that are above where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God; seek the things that are above, not the things that are on earth. For just as he remained with us even after his ascension, so we too are already in heaven with him, even though what is promised us has not yet been fulfilled in our bodies". Christ is now exalted above the heavens, but he still suffers on earth all the pain that we, the members of his body, must bear. He showed this when he cried out from above: Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me? and when he said: I was hungry, and you gave me food.

Why do we on earth not strive to find rest with him in heaven even now, through the faith, hope and love that unites us to him? While in heaven he is also with us; and we while on earth are with him. He is here with us by his divinity, his power, and his love. We cannot be in heaven, as he is on earth, by divinity, but in him, we can be there by love.

He did not leave heaven when he came down to us; nor did he withdraw from us when he went up again into heaven. The fact that he was in heaven even while he was on earth is borne out by his own statement: No one has ever ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man, who is in heaven.

These words are explained by our oneness with Christ, for he is our head, and we are his body. No one ascended into heaven except Christ because we also are Christ: he is the Son of Man by his union with us, and we by our union with him are the sons of God. So, the Apostle says: Just as the human body, which has many members, is a unity, because all the different members make one body, so is it also with Christ. He too has many members, but one body.

Out of compassion for us he descended from heaven, and although he ascended alone, we also ascend, because we are in him by grace. Thus, only Christ descended and only Christ ascended; not because there is no distinction between the head and the body, but because the body as a unity cannot be separated from the head.

In the Creed we say that Jesus "ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father". Jesus' earthly life culminated with the Ascension, when he passed from this world to the Father and was raised to sit on his right. What does this event mean? How does it affect our life? Why do our hearts need to ascend with him? An unknown author wrote a very interesting story ("Letter from God"):

"As you got up, I watched and hoped you would talk to me. Just a few words, such as thanking me for something good in your life yesterday or last week would do.

But I noticed you were busy selecting the right clothes for work. I waited again to hear from you. When you ran around the house collecting papers, I knew there would be a few minutes to stop and say hello, but you never slowed down.

I wanted to tell you that I could help you accomplish more than you ever dreamed possible if you would just spend some of each day with me. At one point, you waited fifteen minutes in a chair with nothing to do. I waited to hear from you.

Then I saw you spring to your feet; I thought you wanted to talk to me, but you ran to the phone and called a friend. I watched as off to work you went and patiently waited all day long to hear from you. With all your activities you were too busy to talk with me.

I noticed at lunch you looked around; maybe you just felt embarrassed to talk to me. You glanced three tables over and noticed some of your friends talking to me before they ate, but you didn't.

There was still more time left, and I hoped that we would talk. You went home and had many things to do. After they were done, you turned on the TV; just about

anything goes there and you spend many hours watching. I waited as you continued watching TV and ate your meal but again you didn't talk to me.

At bedtime you were totally tired. After you said good night to your family you plopped into bed and fell asleep. I had so much wanted to be part of your day. We could have had so much fun and accomplished so much together.

I love you so much that I wait every day for a thought, prayer or thanks. Well, maybe tomorrow! I'll be waiting.

Your Friend, God.

Pope Francis said, "it is a day in which we direct our gaze to heaven, then back to our mission on earth". In fact, that is the place where our hearts ascend to him. Though this day must be very sad day for the disciples to see their brother, friend, teacher, master, and Rabbi is leaving them physically for good which we feel the same on the passing of our dear and near ones. However, on the other hand their hearts are ascending with the Lord to be joyful that they are not alone, but the Lord is with them to end of the age.

In the scripture today we come to know about the instructions given by Jesus before he departed from earth to his Father to be seated on the right hand of him. In the words of Holy Father "This feast contains two elements," the Holy Father explains, "On one hand, it directs our look to Heaven, where Jesus, glorified, is seated at the right hand of God (Mark 16:19). On the other, it recalls the beginning of the Church's mission: why? Because Jesus risen and ascended into Heaven sends His disciples to spread the Gospel throughout the world; therefore, the Ascension exhorts us to raise our gaze to Heaven, to then turn it back immediately to earth, carrying out the tasks that the Risen Lord has entrusted to us." The legacy we have is not human but divine because Jesus has given us a mission which has twofold action orientated: First to baptize everyone in the name of Holy Trinity and secondly to be witnesses to the end of the world. Holy Father continues to explain "The mission entrusted by Jesus to the Apostles has been carried out through the centuries, and it continues still today: it requires the collaboration of us all, each one, in fact, by dint of the Baptism he/she received, is qualified on his/her part to proclaim the Gospel. It is in fact Baptism that qualifies us and drives us to be missionaries, to proclaim the Gospel. As at the beginning the Risen Christ sent His Apostles with the strength of the Holy Spirit, so today He sends all of us, with the same strength, to put concrete

and visible signs of hope; because Jesus gives us hope; He has gone to Heaven and has opened the doors of Heaven and the hope that we will arrive there."

As days are being extended towards the lockdown, all over the world, the stress and frustration of people is also growing stronger and stronger everyday. There are lot of information and misinformation out there on the media. People are becoming confused with what to believe and what to reject. The hearts of people are sinking into the deepest darkness of doubts and uncertainties. Everyone is questioning "why do we on earth find rest and peace? However, if you trust in the Lord, our hearts will ascend to him who won victory death and gain for us the crown of eternal glory. Someone wrote a very interesting testimony about how God helps in our journey of faith.

"This is my true-life story. It starts with me being down on my luck in Los Angeles and ending up homeless for 3 1/2 years sleeping in alleyways, the subways, homeless shelters, in abandon buildings, and just on the sidewalks of Los Angeles. One frigid night I was trying to sleep in between some office buildings in the city of Toluca Lake, but because I had not eaten in three days, I could not get to sleep. I was suffering so much, and I was so hungry that I said to myself that if I did not get any food today, I was going to kill myself.

I got up around 6 am and hid my sleeping bag in the bushes, it was a very foggy day. I remember thinking to myself that if I could just get \$3.45, it would allow me to go over to the red building breakfast place on Riverside Boulevard and get breakfast. But where and how could I get the money. \$3.45 at that time in my life was like trying to get \$1,000.

I started walking down the alley in the thick fog, and out of nowhere and an older man with a cane came walking toward me, stopped, and said hello. I spoke back to him, he then turned towards the direction he just came from and tells me that there is some money by the tree back there by the red bricks on the left side of the alley. He then tells me that he cannot get the money because he can't bend down due to his bad back.

I was so excited that I started walking past him, about five or six steps I remembered that I did not say thank you, but when I turned back to say thanks, he was gone. I tried my best to find him by going up and down the alley, but he had just vanished.

He was walking more slowly than an old Turtle with that cane, so how could he disappear like that.

I went to the location that he told me about and found the tree in someone's front yard. I walked over to the tree and looked and looked and nothing was there, so I gave up and walked across the street, but a little voice in my head told me to go back to the tree and try again. So, I turned around and went back to the tree and got on both knees. On the ground spread all around the tree were those red woodchips that people put down, but I saw no money. That was it, and I had made up my mind, today was the day that I was going to kill myself.

Weak, tired, cold, and still sleepy, I got up and made my way across the street again. But again, that small voice spoke to me and said, go back and try one more time, so I turned in the middle of the street and went back for one last try. As I made my way back to the tree, I had a quick vision of myself jumping off an office building somewhere or jumping off the freeway overpass in Burbank.

When I got to the tree again, I got down on both knees and looked, but saw nothing. But just then that small voice said to me, why do you not take your hands and move some of the red woodchips out of the way, and so I did, and to my great surprise, there were some coins. After quickly grabing up the coins and heading across the street to count it, to my happiness, the total amount was \$3.45. Just enough for my first meal in three days and to save my life!

Holy Father reflecting on the Feast of the Ascension said "Out of compassion for us he descended from heaven, and although he ascended alone, we also ascend, because we are in him by grace. Thus, only Christ descended and no one but Christ ascended; not because there is no distinction between the head and the body, but because the body as a unity cannot be separated from the head". St. Paul reminds us with these words "who can separate us from the Love of Jesus". No one can because Jesus is our legacy and love.

Our hearts ascend because God waits for us to come back to him and find him and only through his Son, we can go him who is ascended into heaven today and interceding for us. Stacey Randall wrote a beautiful tribute for the victims of 9/11 reminding everyone not to loose heart but trust in him: "You say you will never forget where you were when you heard the news on September 11, 2001? Neither will I.

I was on the 110th floor in a smoke-filled room with a man who called his wife to say "Goodbye." I held his fingers steady as he dialed. I gave him the peace to say, "Honey, I am not going to make it, but it is okay...I am ready to go."

I was with his wife when he called as she fed breakfast to their children. I held her up as she tried to understand his words and as she realized he was not coming home that night.

I was in the stairwell of the 23rd floor when a woman cried out to Me for help. "I have been knocking on the door of your heart for 50 years!" I said. "Of course, I will show you the way home - only believe in Me now."

I was at the base of the building with the priest ministering to the injured and devastated souls. I took him home to tend to his flock in Heaven. He heard my voice and answered.

I was on all four of those planes, in every seat, with every prayer. I was with the crew as they were overtaken. I was in the very hearts of the believers there, comforting and assuring them that their faith has saved them.

I was in Texas, Kansas, London. I was standing next to you when you heard the terrible news. Did you sense Me?

I want you to know that I saw every face. I knew every name - though not all know Me. Some met Me for the first time on the 86th floor.

Some sought Me with their last breath.

Some couldn't hear Me calling to them through the smoke and flames; "Come to Me...this way...take my hand." Some chose, for the final time, to ignore Me. But, I was there.


I did not place you in the Tower that day. You may not know why, but I do. However, if you were there in that explosive moment in time, would you have reached for Me?

September 11, 2001 was not the end of the journey for you. But someday your journey will end. And I will be there for you as well. Seek Me now while I may be found. Then, at any moment, you know you are "ready to go."

I will be in the stairwell of your final moments.


Vatican's new document on climate crisis

The climate crisis has a very human face. It is already a reality for multitudes of vulnerable people worldwide. Climate warming of merely 1.5°C would cause global sea levels to rise by 0.77 metres by 2100, threatening



cities and crop and pasture land around the world. Projections based on current data predict a global temperature increase of 3-4°C by 2100.

The Vatican's Migrants and Refugees Section of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development has recently published and presented a resource document entitled, <u>Pastoral Orientations on Climate Displaced People</u>. The resource highlights the new challenges posed by climate disruption and displacement and suggests pastoral responses to the global situation and crisis.





Mount St. Francis Retreat Centre is nestled in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains where are all welcome in the name of Christ. The Franciscan Friars of Canada, inspired by the vision and example of St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi, have served here since 1949.

We offer silent retreats and spiritual direction. We also serve those in the 12 Step Program through weekend and evening Serenity retreats. We listen to 5th steps. We host groups and individuals seeking a place of quiet and stillness in an often-hectic world. We can accommodate up to 50 people (46 rooms/50 beds). We have one large and one small meeting room, a library and chapel. We can accommodate most dietary restrictions. There are approximately 500 acres to explore.
